Advertisement for Bids

Sealed bids for a <u>Security and Surveillance System</u> will be received by the Housing Authority of the City of New Brunswick ("Housing Authority"), 7 Van Dyke Avenue, New Brunswick, New Jersey 08901, until 12:00 PM on Tuesday, May 14, 2024. The Housing Authority is seeking to replace its current security and surveillance system for its forty (40) public housing buildings.

The bid documents can be obtained via electronic mail from the Housing Authority's Executive Director, Daniel Toto, at dtoto@nbnjha.org.

An original and one (1) copy of the bid must be submitted in a sealed package to the Housing Authority. The package must be clearly marked with the words "Security & Surveillance System Bid" and include the respondent's company name and return address. All bids must be received at the address and by the deadline stated above. Bids received after the deadline for any reason shall not be considered and will be returned to the sender.

No bids shall be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days following the bid submission deadline. The Housing Authority reserves the right to reject any and all bids and/or to waive any informality in the bidding. The successful bidder(s) will be required to execute the Housing Authority's contract within seven (7) days of contract award.

1. PURPOSE

The Housing Authority of the City of New Brunswick (hereinafter called the "Housing Authority") is a public housing authority with administrative offices located at 7 Van Dyke Avenue, New Brunswick, New Jersey 08901. The Housing Authority provides quality, affordable housing to low-income families and seniors through its Public Housing and Housing Choice Voucher programs.

In accordance with applicable Federal and State of New Jersey requirements, the Housing Authority is currently accepting bids for upgrades to its **Security and Surveillance System**. The successful bidder shall provide the Housing Authority with specifications for an appropriate upgrade encompassing the matching the specifications provided herein.

The Housing Authority shall award a contract to the lowest responsible bidder. If bids are received for multiple camera systems and/or models, a contract shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder for the security system which best meets the specifications provided by the Housing Authority at its discretion.

The successful bidder must provide the proposed details in accordance with applicable international, federal, state, and local statutes, rules, regulations, ordinances, orders, and codes (including but not limited to the rules, orders, directives, and regulations promulgated by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD")).

2. SPECIFICATIONS

Bidders shall provide pricing for all equipment (cameras, servers, wiring, etc.) and labor required for the replacement and installation of the Housing Authority's current security and surveillance system located at its public housing properties – Schwartz Homes and Robeson Village. The properties consist of a total of forty (40) buildings of various sizes. Bidders shall supply sufficient documentation for the proposed equipment to establish that it contains all specified features (or equivalent) and to identify all warranty coverage. An alternative feature must have the same functionality as the feature specified in order to be deemed equivalent.

As a federally-funded agency, all labor required for this Project shall be subject to Davis-Bacon prevailing wages the contractor shall be required to provide the Housing Authority with certified payrolls documenting such prior to payment. Bid prices shall include all proposed costs and charges.

SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM SPECIFICATIONS:

The proposed Security & Surveillance System shall meet the following required specifications for consideration:

- Cloud: Preference will be given to a hybrid cloud security platform, where products are managed. Preference will be given to a solution that does not necessitate the use of NVRs / DVRs through a single pane of glass
- Platform: Interface is easy to navigate and can be managed under a centralized platform through a single pane of glass
- Support: 24/7 technical support included (call, email, chat), at no additional cost, including weekends and holidays
- Updates: Automatic firmware and software updates, at no additional cost
- Enhancements: New features and enhancements are added at no additional cost
- Integration: Native integration with vendor's own (including but not limited to access control, alarms, etc.) to allow for a comprehensive response to security threats
- Scalability: System should be easy to scale across sites
- Predictable Costs: No additional / unpredictable costs associated with solution e.g., ongoing maintenance costs, server replacement costs
- Security: Data is fully encrypted in transit and at rest and traffic is transmitted over the network using TLS v1.2 and encrypted with AES. The system must also have the ability to integrate with Single-Sign-On (SSO) providers; offer Multi Factor Authentication options
- Compliance: System is SOC 2 and NDAA compliant
- Warranty: All cameras (except PTZ and older dome models) must come with a 10-year warranty
- Camera Portfolio: Full range of camera types offered: domes, mini-domes, bullets, fisheyes, multisensors and PTZs
- Resolution: Minimum of 2MP (1920 x 1080), and up to 8MP (3840 x 2160) resolution; up to 12MP (4056 x 3040) for fisheye cameras
- Physical Impact: IK08 vandal resistant rating or above, to protect against external mechanical impacts
- Environmental Impact: At least IP66 rating to protect against dust and environmental elements for outdoor cameras
- Onboard Storage: Minimum of 128GB and up to 2TB for mini / standard domes, up to 8TB for multisensor, and up to 3TB for PTZ
- Retention: Built in solid state storage drive, with a minimum of 30 (guaranteed), and up to

365 days of retention

- Backup: 30-days cloud backup included with each camera
- Archiving: True unlimited archiving any footage archived goes to the cloud and is kept indefinitely across all cameras
- Recording: Must be able to record 24/7, including audio
- Face Blur: Ability to blur faces in live streams
- Infrared (IR): IR illumination for night visibility, minimum of 10m (33ft.) and up to 30m (98ft.) range; up to 100m (328ft.) for PTZ
- Frame Rate: 24 FPS by default (U.S.)
- Bandwidth: Solution should have a small bandwidth footprint (20-50 kbps). No extra server/bandwidth/network upgrades required. System needs to have the ability to multiplex one stream from the cloud to 100+ remote users to conserve bandwidth when streaming live events and the ability to monitor, view and stop streams to optimize bandwidth allocation, and enforce bandwidth caps using TCP congestion control
- Video Monitoring: 24/7 video monitoring and verification by a monitoring agent who is five diamond certified by TMA included at no extra cost
- Analytics: Capability to perform computer vision analytics at the edge people analytics, vehicle analytics, license plate recognition, tamper alerts, included with purchase
- People Analytics: Provide the ability to filter video based on date and time range, and the physical description of a person (clothing color on top, clothing color on bottom, wearing a backpack, etc.) with Facial recognition capability available
- Vehicle Analytics: Ability to filter video based on make, body and color of vehicles (cars, buses, trucks and motorcycles)
- License Plate Recognition: Ability to recognize and monitor license plates and ability to create "License Plates of Interest", i.e., create a hotlist of license plates
- Motion Search: Ability to select region in feed and return instances of that motion
- Trajectories: Ability to trace trajectories for people and vehicles
- Loitering: Ability to set an area and determine if a person has been loitering in that area for a given period of time
- Line Crossing: Ability to be alerted if a person has crossed a given line
- Hot Spots: Ability to identify and search "hot spots" in a camera's field of view for motion
- Export: Have the ability to export industry-standard video formats of selected video footage that can be viewed on standard platforms without a proprietary viewer
- Heatmaps: Ability to show heatmaps of live and historical views of where activity is taking place

- Search: Have the ability to search for a unique face captured by the camera across multiple cameras and multiple sites
- Access: Ability to securely access and view footage from anywhere in the world, onsite or remote
- APIs: Streaming APIs to ingest live stream or historical footage into any web app
- Mobile Access: Ability to view footage and conduct analytics on mobile (iOS / Android)
- Floor Plans: Have the ability to upload floor plans into the camera system and place cameras on that floor plan, and show motion in those floor plans
- Incident Management: Ability to consolidate, review and annotate footage and collaborate securely to streamline investigations and simplify reporting
- Alerts: Ability to consolidate all alerts across vendor's native products in one central location
- Live Alerts: Live alerts and notifications for when uploaded faces/people are detected by any camera
- Crowd Detection: Crowd detection alerts for when people are congregating
- Email & SMS: Provide either email or SMS notification of critical system events (camera failure, tampering, etc.)
- Person of Interest: Person of interest (POI) notifications
- Sharing: Ability to share live link or historical footage of a single camera or group of cameras with a set of external contacts (e.g., first responders)
- Users: Software allows for an unlimited number of Administrative Users without additional software licenses. Configurable role-based user permissions and site-based product access
- Backup Battery: Must have a built—in backup battery to keep the system online for up to 12 hours in the event of a power loss
- Backup Compatibility: Compatibility with vendor's own cellular backup module for multiple backup LTE connections for the wireless hub
- Setup: Fast setup with plug-n-play cameras, without needing to open port forwards or set up VPNs
- Connection: Standard RJ45 connectivity including Power Over Ethernet (PoE) capability to receive power
- Encryption: HTTPs encrypted by default
- Compliance: UL / CUL 62368-1 certification for audio/video, information and communication technology equipment
- Advanced RMA: Advanced RMA at no additional cost

Bidder shall provide a detailed written proposal listing the proposed make, model, optional equipment and features of all equipment being offered. Bidder may offer equipment which exceeds the above requirements. However, bids that fail to meet these minimum requirements will be considered non-responsive. Bidder shall provide manufacturer literature to support all ratings where indicated. Failure to provide literature may cause the bid to be rendered non-responsive and rejected.

3. QUALIFICATIONS

All respondents shall meet the following minimum requirements:

- A. Is authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey.
- B. Has the capability to provide the requested equipment and services in accordance with the requirements described herein.
- C. Has never, at any time, been suspended, debarred, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, the U.S. Department of Justice, the U.S. General Services Administration, the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, or any other federal agency or the Federal Government, and/or the N.J. Department of Labor, or any other state agency or the State of New Jersey.

Failure to meet any of the foregoing qualifications is considered a material defect and shall result in the disqualification of the Respondent.

4. SUBMISSION OF BIDS

5. BID REQUIREMENTS

Each bidder shall submit one (1) original and one (1) copy of the entire bid, including all documentation specified on the bid checklist. <u>Failure to provide any of the required documentation at the time of submission may be considered a fatal defect warranting rejection of the bid.</u>

6. BID REVIEW AND AWARD

No bids shall be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) days following the bid submission deadline. The Housing Authority reserves the right to reject any and all bids and/or to waive any informality in the bidding. The successful bidder will be required to execute the Housing Authority's contract within seven (7) days of contract award.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990 Equal Opportunity for Individuals with Disability

The contractor and the Housing Authority of the City of New Brunswick (hereafter "owner") do hereby agree that the provisions of Title II of the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990 (the "Act") (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by public entities in all services, programs, and activities provided or made available by public entities, and the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant there unto, are made a part of this contract. In providing any aid, benefit, or service on behalf of the owner pursuant to this contract, the contractor agrees that the performance shall be in strict compliance with the Act. In the event that the contractor, its agents, servants, employees, or subcontractors violate or are alleged to have violated the Act during the performance of this contract, the contractor shall defend the owner in any action or administrative proceeding commenced pursuant to this Act. The contractor shall indemnify, protect, and save harmless the owner, its agents, servants, and employees from and against any and all suits, claims, losses, demands, or damages, of whatever kind or nature arising out of or claimed to arise out of the alleged violation. The contractor shall, at its own expense, appear, defend, and pay any and all charges for legal services and any and all costs and other expenses arising from such action or administrative proceeding or incurred in connection therewith. In any and all complaints brought pursuant to the owner's grievance procedure, the contractor agrees to abide by any decision of the owner which is rendered pursuant to said grievance procedure. If any action or administrative proceeding results in an award of damages against the owner, or if the owner incurs any expense to cure a violation of the ADA which has been brought pursuant to its grievance procedure, the contractor shall satisfy and discharge the same at its own expense.

The owner shall, as soon as practicable after a claim has been made against it, give written notice thereof to the contractor along with full and complete particulars of the claim, If any action or administrative proceeding is brought against the owner or any of its agents, servants, and employees, the *owner shall* expeditiously forward or have forwarded to the contractor every demand, complaint, notice, summons, pleading, or other process received by the owner or its representatives.

It is expressly agreed and understood that any approval by the owner of the services provided by the contractor pursuant to this contract will not relieve the contractor of the obligation to comply with the Act and to defend, indemnify, protect, and save harmless the owner pursuant to this paragraph.

It is further agreed and understood that the owner assumes no obligation to indemnify or save harmless the contractor, its agents, servants, employees and subcontractors for any claim which may arise out of their performance of this Agreement. Furthermore, the contractor expressly understands and agrees that the provisions of this indemnification clause shall in no way limit the contractor's obligations assumed in this Agreement, nor shall they be construed to relieve the contractor from any liability, nor preclude the owner from taking any other actions available to it under any other provisions of the Agreement or otherwise at law.

2. Submission of Offers

 - (2) identifying the amendment number and date in the space provided for this purpose on the form for submitting an offer,
 - (3) letter or telegram, or
 - (4) facsimile, if facsimile offers are authorized in the solicitation. The HA/HUD must receive the acknowledgment by the time specified for receipt of offers.

4. Explanation to Prospective Offerors

Any prospective offeror desiring an explanation or interpretation of the solicitation, statement of work, etc., must request it in writing soon enough to allow a reply to reach all prospective offerors before the submission of their offers. Oral explanations or instructions given before the award of the contract will not be binding. Any information given to a prospective offeror concerning a solicitation will be furnished promptly to all other prospective offerors as an amendment of the solicitation, if that information is necessary in submitting offers or if the lack of it would be prejudicial to any other prospective offerors.

5. Responsibility of Prospective Contractor

Proposals may be withdrawn in person by a offeror or its authorized representative if the identity of the person requesting withdrawal is established and the person signs a receipt for the offer before award. If this solicitation is an invitation for bids, bids may be withdrawn at any time prior to bid opening.

7. Contract Award

(a) The HA will award a contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible offeror whose offer conforming to the solicitation will be most advantageous to the HA, cost or price and other factors, specified elsewhere in this solicitation, considered.

(b) The HA may

- (1) reject any or all offers if such action is in the HA's interest,
- (2) accept other than the lowest offer,
- (3) waive informalities and minor irregularities in offers received, and (4) award more than one contract for all or part of the requirements stated.
- (c) If this solicitation is a request for proposals, the HA may award a contract on the basis of initial offers received, without discussions. Therefore, each initial offer should contain the offeror's best terms from a cost or price and technical standpoint.

- (d) A written award or acceptance of offer mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful offeror within the time for acceptance specified in the offer shall result in a binding contract without further action by either party.
